
Early Life and Influences





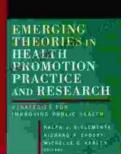
