
Paint and Blood: The Interplay of Art and Violence



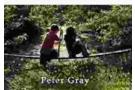

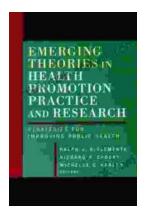
